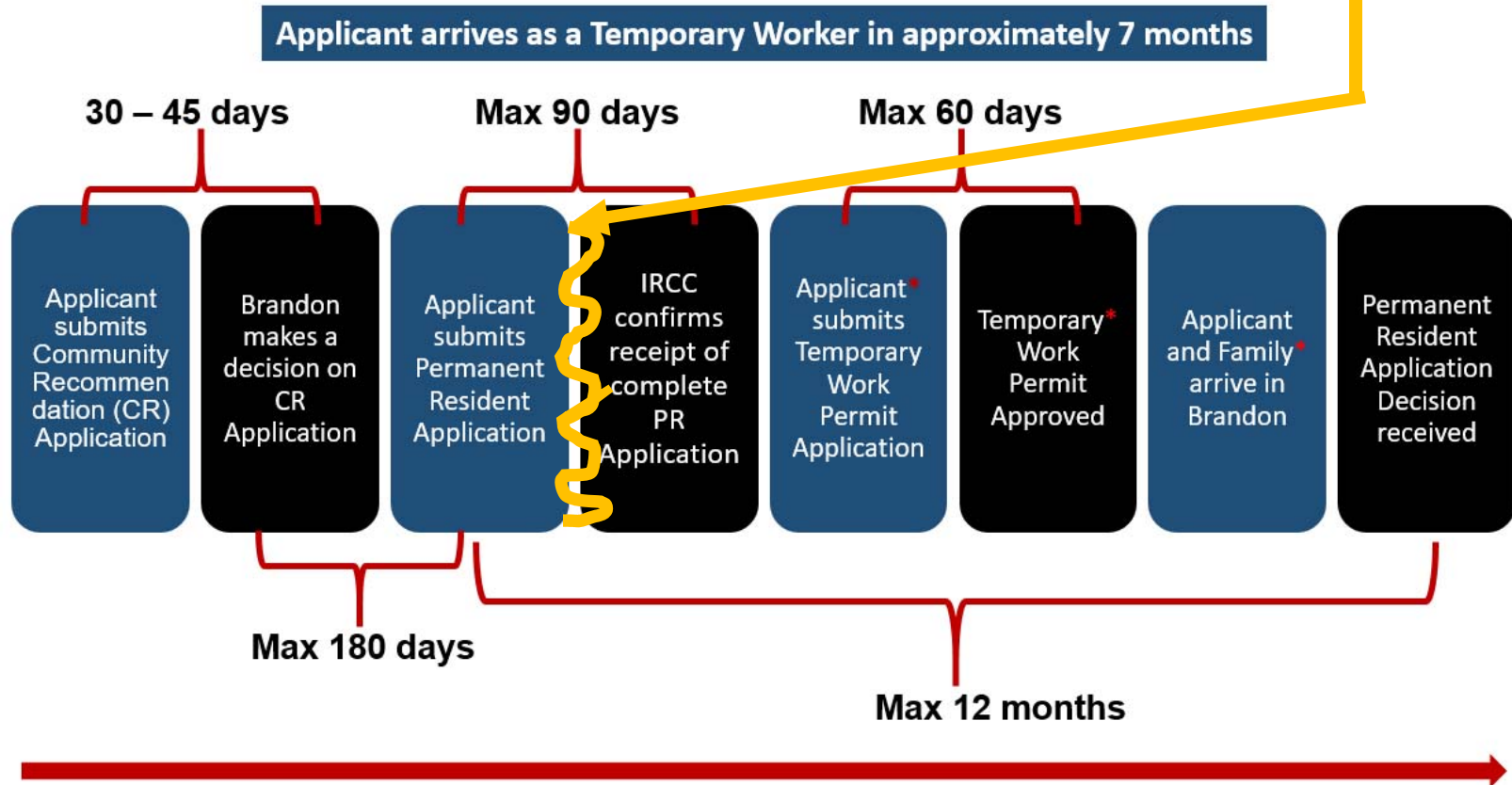


Temporary public policy permits RNIP applicants to apply for a temporary work once they submit their RNIP Permanent Resident Application and pay the associated fees. The courier / mail receipt and fee payment receipt associated with the Permanent Resident Application must accompany the Temporary Work Permit application.



Timelines associated with the **Blue steps** in the Brandon RNIP process are dependent upon the timeliness of action by the Foreign National thus cannot be definitively stated.

Black steps in the Brandon RNIP process have timelines for approval established by Brandon and Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada as noted above.

* Submitting a Temporary Resident Application is not mandatory, however Economic Development Brandon strongly encourages this to occur as it provides a quicker solution to chronic labour needs and provides an opportunity for the Foreign National to settle into community and the workplace.
